Life with Brian: Lessons from the Mulroney Institute of Government



Donald E. Abelson teaches and conducts research in the fields of Comparative Politics (Canada and the US) and International Relations. Before joining McMaster in October 2023, he served as the Inaugural Director of the Brian Mulroney Institute of Government, the Steven K. Hudson Chair in Canada-US Relations, and Professor, Political Science, St. Francis Xavier University. He is the author of several books, including Understanding American Politics, Third Edition, (with Stephen Brooks and Melissa Haussman, University of Toronto Press, 2024); History Has Made Us Friends: Rethinking the Special Relationship between Canada and the United States, (co-edited with Stephen Brooks, McGill-Queen's University Press, 2024). He is also the author of over five-dozen journal articles and book chapters. Dr. Abelson also appears regularly on various media networks in Canada, the United States, Europe, and the Middle East to discuss Canada-US relations and US foreign policy.
